(November 10, 2022) – To celebrate the U.S. Department of Labor's eighth annual National Apprenticeship Week (NAW), the County of Orange and Orange County Workforce Development Board (OCWDB) are hosting a series of virtual apprenticeship information sessions in partnership with the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers.

"The County is proud to support National Apprenticeship Week and showcase the impact apprenticeships have on building the workforce in Orange County," said Chairman Doug Chaffee, Fourth District Supervisor.

"These programs are a great benefit to employers in that they can train and cultivate workers to meet their specific standards."
