



Orange County Hazard Mitigation Plan Update

The County of Orange and the Orange County Fire Authority are updating the Hazard Mitigation Plan, which supports reducing risk from natural hazards, such as wildfires, earthquakes, and floods. The update process occurs every five years and is focused on protecting community members, businesses and critical services in the County, especially in unincorporated areas. Hearing from the community is important to support prioritization and to ensure that community risks are covered within the plan.
